## MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

# BETWEEN THE DIRECTOR ILLINOIS EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY

#### AND

# COMMANDER AIR FORCE RESCUE COORDINATION CENTER LANGLEY AFB VIRGINIA

- 1. PURPOSE: To further delineate the operational procedures pursuant to the Search and Rescue (SAR) Agreement dated 30 MARCH 2006 between the State of ILLINOIS and the Inland SAR Coordinator. The procedures outlined below are intended for use within the geographical boundaries of the State of ILLINOIS. On incidents or missions involving interstate flights or missions of national concern, the general procedures outlined in the basic SAR agreement will apply.
- 2. **DEFINITIONS**: To ensure both parties understand a common terminology, the following definitions are provided:
  - a. INCIDENT A notification by any source of a possible distress situation.
  - MISSION Those incidents that require the activation of federal air or ground assets and the expenditure of federal funds.
  - SEARCH FOR MISSING AIRCRAFT Searches for persons missing in an aircraft believed to be in distress.
  - d. SEARCH FOR MISSING PERSONS Searches for persons believed to be in a distress situation not involving an aircraft.
  - RESCUE / MEDEVAC / MERCY MISSION Recovering, medical evacuation, moving donor organs, blood, or SAR dogs to assist in the time critical saving of life or limb.
  - RESPONSIBLE AGENCY The federal or state agency with overall responsibility to coordinate the search effort regardless of assets being used.
  - g. COORDINATE The mutual agreement between two or more agencies as to the actions taken.
  - ADVISE / NOTIFY The communication of actions which have been or will be taken regardless of concurrence.

Search and Rescue MOU - Page 1

- i. FEDERAL ASSETS Those SAR capable resources belonging to the federal government.
- CIVIL AIR PATROL AUTHORIZATION When mission participation is authorized by the AFRCC, CAP becomes a federal asset. Notification to CAP must be made by the AFRCC.

#### 3. PROCEDURES:

TYPE MISSION / INCIDENT Emergency Locator Transmitter (ELT)	RESPONSIBLE AGENCY AFRCC	PROCEDURES The AFRCC will, in coordination with the Federal Aviation Administration, accomplish a communication check and will coordinate with the Illinois Emergency Management Agency prior to opening a mission.	
Alert Notices Incident (ALNOT)	AFRCC	The AFRCC will accomplish the required extensive communications check on all alert notices and will coordinate with the Illinois Emergency Management Agency prior to mission opening.	
Missing Aircraft Mission	IEMA	The AFRCC will coordinate all federal asset requests including CAP through the Illinois Emergency Management Agency.	
Missing Person Mission	IEMA	The AFRCC will coordinate all federal asset requests including CAP through the Illinois Emergency Management Agency responsible for SAR.	
Personal Locator Beacon (PLB)	IEMA	PLB alerts will be sent to IEMA. The AFRCC will coordinate all Federal asset requests through the Illinois Emergency Management Agency as the state agency acting for the County Sheriff.	
Rescue / MEDEVAC / Mercy	IEMA	The Illinois Emergency Management Agency will receive, locate and request appropriate resources to accomplish civil SAR tasking. If federal assets are required, the IEMA will contact the AFRCC who	

will activate federal resources to assist the Illinois Emergency Management Agency.

National Alert Warning System (NAWAS)

No restrictions within the State of Illinois.
